CCTV HOPES IN MISSING MAN PROBE Published on 14/03/2006

Detectives investigating the disappearance of a Northern Ireland man hope new CCTV footage will provide a breakthrough in the inquiry.

Martin Kelly, of Co Down, who would have been 22

today, has not been seen since he left Pat's Bar in the docks area of Belfast on New Year's Day.

Police are trying to establish the plumber's movements in the 40-minute period after he declined a lift in a taxi back to his Holywood home at 6.30pm and returned to the bar.

Mr Kelly left the pub almost immediately but no evidence has been uncovered that he was a victim of crime.

Four images, taken from street cameras, were released today.

The first shows a man leaving the side entrance of Pat's Bar shortly after 7.15pm on January 1.

A minute later, the second image shows an unidentified man walking in the direction of the River Lagan, close to the CCEA building.

The Police Service of Northern Ireland said both images could be Mr Kelly.

Police are also keen to identify two other men caught on CCTV on the same evening.

A bald man was seen walking in the car park of the Prudential Building Society at 8 20nm

The second man was seen some 10 minutes later, walking from Princes Dock Street towards Corporation Street.
