Belfast Telegraph Home > **News****CCTV clues to missing down man**

Police searching for missing Co Down man Martin Kelly have released grainy CCTV footage - which could be his last movements.

Today is the 22nd birthday of Martin, who went missing on New Year's Day after leaving a bar in the docks area of Belfast.

It is widely believed the Holywood man may have fallen into the water and his family recently employed the help of a psychic to help trace his body.

Police today said they want to identify four images taken from surrounding CCTV cameras in the vicinity of Pat's Bar on the evening of the January 1 when Martin was last seen.

A police spokeswoman admitted that although the images have been enhanced they are still of poor quality.

However, it is hoped they may jog someone's memory or assist in identifying the four people featured.

The first image is of a man leaving the side entrance of Pat's Bar shortly after 7.15pm.

One minute later the second image shows an unidentified male walking in the direction of the River Lagan close to the CCEA building.

A police spokeswoman said: "These two images may be the same man and we cannot rule out the possibility that this may be Martin."

Police are also keen to identify two other people caught on CCTV. One is a bald headed man seen walking in the car park of the Prudential Building Society at 8.20pm. A second man is seen some ten minutes later walking from Princes Dock Street towards Corporation Street.

Detectives involved in the enquiry are also trying to establish Martin's movements for a period of some 40 minutes on the evening of January 1.

He left the bar at approximately 6.30pm but declined a lift in a taxi back to Holywood He returned to the bar at around 7:10pm but his whereabouts during those 40 minutes remain unexplained.

A police spokeswoman said: "We have no evidence to suggest that Martin has been the victim of crime."

Last Friday clairvoyant Diane Lazarus flew into Belfast to retrace Martin's last known steps with members of his family.

Martin's mother Karen said: "Diane has given us some hope he will be found soon. At the moment I have no life - we need Martin to come home."
