Belfast police re-trace movements of missing man

Police in Belfast were today trying to establish the movements of a 21-year-old man over a 40 minute period after he vanished exactly a year ago.

Martin Kelly has not been seen since he left a bar in Belfast's docklands on New Year's Day 2006.

But his family have not given up hope of ever seeing him again.

Despite public appeals, police enquires in Northern Ireland and beyond the UK, land and sea searches and the launch of a website highlighting his disappearance, he has not returned.

Police in Belfast today revisited the pub, Pat's Bar in Garmoyle Street, where he had been drinking with friends before his disappearance.

Mr Kelly had been working on New Year's Eve in the Priory Inn in Holywood in County Down. Afterwards he had gone to two house parties to welcome in the New Year.

He is described as six foot one inch tall, of slim build, with short dark hair and green eyes, and was wearing a black Guinness T-shirt and blue jeans.
